Mr. Wopansao Patton shared his journey and expertise with the students, focusing on:

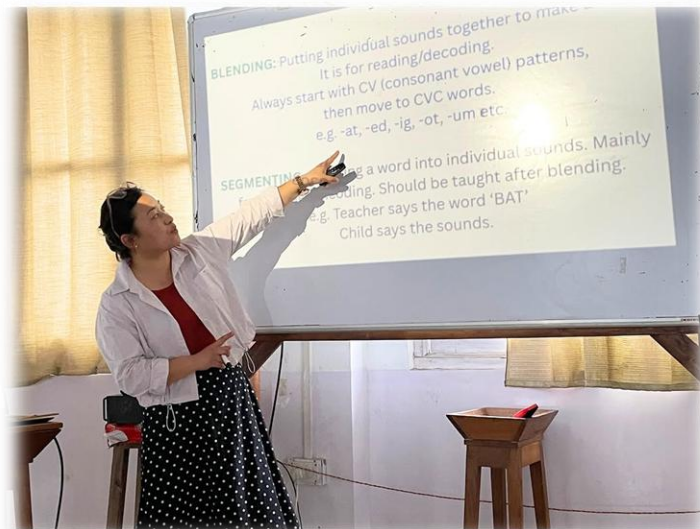
The fundamental mindset required to start a venture. Identifying local opportunities and scaling them into sustainable enterprises.

Animal, Bird and Aquatic cum Blue Day

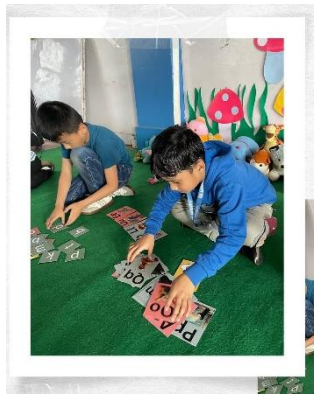
