Third Position: Group 1 – Probability and Pythagoras

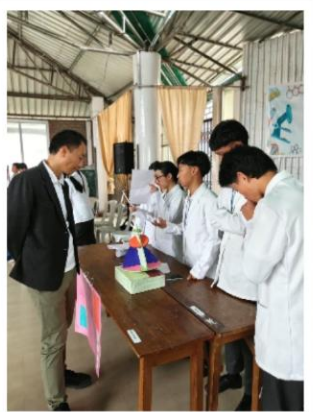
The exhibition concluded successfully, fostering scientific curiosity, creativity, and collaborative learning among students.

Free Medical Camp

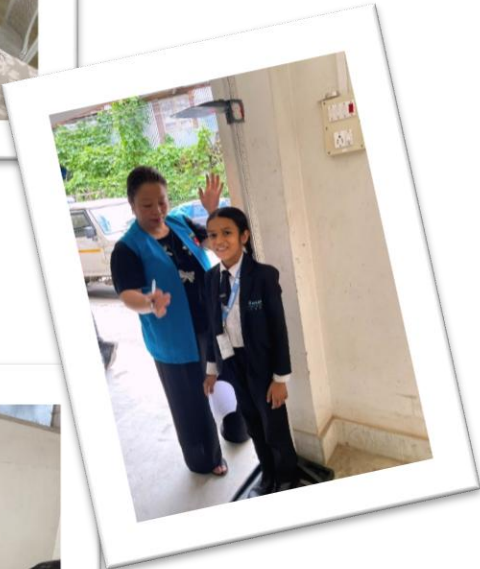

Mock Drill on Disaster Management



Modern Higher Secondary School organised a Mock Drill on Disaster Management for students from LKG to Class IV on 28th August 2026, in collaboration with the Fire Department, Kohima. Four fire personnel ,Kenilo Khing, Kekhluhol Hibo, Achemo Khing and Benathung Patton conducted the programme.

The personnel introduced the students to different classes of fire , A (solid), B (liquid), C (gas/electrical), D (metal) and K (kitchen fire),and explained the uses of DCP, foam and CO₂ extinguishers. They demonstrated the PASS technique: Pull the pin, Aim at the base, Squeeze the handle and Sweep from side to side.

Safety measures during LPG leakage, including avoiding electrical switches and keeping the area ventilated, were also explained. The students were taught Stop, Drop and Hide during an earthquake and Stop, Drop and Roll when clothes catch fire.The students were instructed to dial 101,the fire emergency number, in case of emergency.

The personnel also demonstrated basic rescue techniques, including one-man and two-man crutches and different hand-lock methods for assisting injured persons. A live demonstration of fire extinguishers was conducted, with students actively participating in the drill. The programme provided students with essential knowledge of fire safety, disaster preparedness and basic rescue techniques.

World of Religion

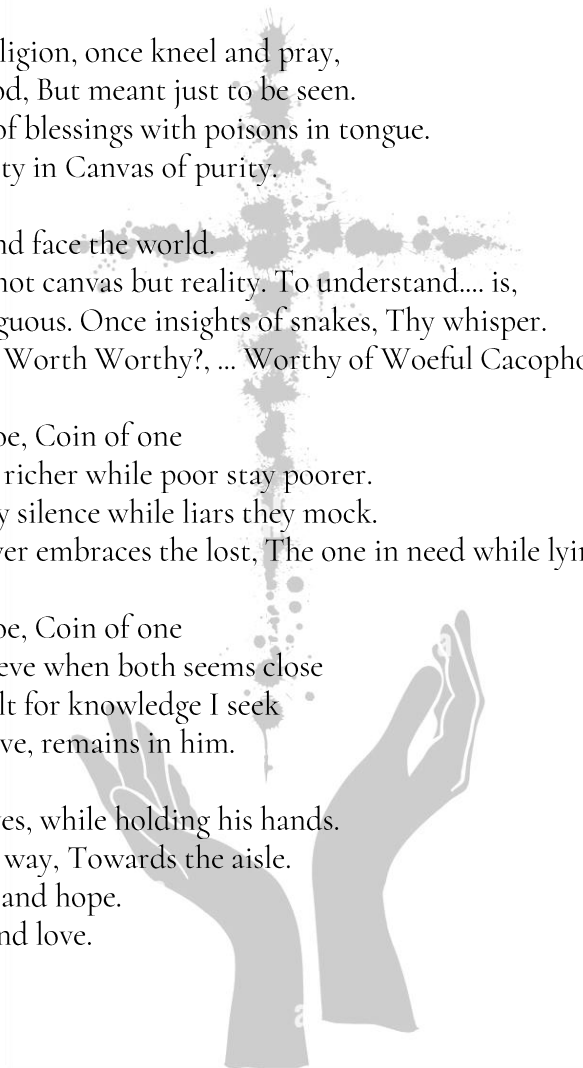
World of Religion, once kneel and pray,
